






The Role of Ethics in Higher Education









Several athletes at a University were enrolled in fake courses that never actually met. This was done to ensure that these athletes maintained their eligibility to play sports at the University. The courses were allegedly created by an administrator and a professor, who were both subsequently fired.

A University admitted several students based on their connections to influential donors and alumni. The university had allowed the applicants to bypass normal admissions procedures and had even falsified their athletic credentials.

A University professor colluded with students to change their grades. The professor had changed the grades to make it appear as though the students had performed better on an exam than they actually had. The University launched an investigation and found that the professor had violated the University's academic integrity policy.

Themes:

- The ends do NOT always justify the means.
- Policies, alone, are not a magic bullet.
- Culture and commitment are key indicators.








United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) Report (2023):

Bias

Lack of transparency of AI tools: AI decisions are not always intelligible to humans.

Al is not neutral: Al-based decisions are susceptible to inaccuracies, discriminatory outcomes, embedded or inserted bias.
