How to Submit

At the time of submission, be prepared to provide:

- Presenter's name, contact info, bio, and headshot
- Presentation title
- Learning objectives (tips available)
- Presentation description
- Field of study
- · Preferred session length
- Additional Details
- Interactive Sessions: Sessions should focus on learning, application, and collaboration
- Signed speaker agreement

Preferred Teaching Strategy:

Audit Interactive employs a specific educational expectation model. We ask that speakers divide each of their sessions into three teaching outcomes:

- Learn Attendees will learn the principle definitions, strategies, guidelines for the topic
- <u>Apply</u> Speakers will provide details (tools, references) on how to use this new knowledge in your office
- <u>Collaborate</u> Attendees will work together on a learning exercise (problem solving, case study, role play)
