# Financial Update

### 2023 Member Meeting Landscape

- Increase in market conference expenses
- Significant unrealized loss on investments due to market conditions
- Investment in transition to new management company
- Ended 2022 with a decrease in Net Assets of (\$311,477)



Heavy analysis and monitoring of conference expenditures



Restructured membership rates, which had not been adjusted in 10 years;

Change in Bylaws to allow for NHE membership category



Shift to virtual spring conference in Spring of 2024

# Meeting Trends

## State of the Industry

### How did we get here?

- COVID-19
- Hotels Closed Lost Revenue
- Staffing Shortages
- Supply Chain

### What are we seeing as a result.

- Recuperating Lost Revenue
- Low Supply & High Demand
  - Rebooking's
  - Travel Demand
- Hotels are taking advantage of the demand

### Hotel Costs & Negotiations

- Harder to negotiate concessions & hotel contract clauses
- Resort fees/destination fees
- Early check-in fees or late checkout fees
- Requiring larger deposits
- Charging for more a la cart items
  - Tables and chairs for exhibitors
  - Meeting room rental
  - Additional AV costs (including tape and batteries)

### Rise in F&B Costs

- F&B prices increased by 5-10%
- Hotels not willing to discount F&B prices (or if so, discount is 5% versus 10-15%)
- Hotels guaranteeing menu prices for the year you are contracted
- Set menus on specific days or increase fees to select a different menu
- Higher F&B minimums
- Service charge fees anywhere between 26-28% (some are still 24% but very few 22-23%)
- Labor fees on small meetings
- Hotel set-up fees
- Higher bartender/chef attendant fees

### Suggestions to help cut costs

- Reduce the number of breakout rooms/sessions
- Condense the length of the conference
- Offer continental breakfast vs hot buffet breakfast
- Offer drink tickets for reception look at how many tickets
- Use of non-traditional venues/hotels/universities/convention centers
- Utilize industry partners


## ACUA's Response











